

was formed in 1986 and has performed regularly ever since including at every Bollington Festival. The group is rebuilding after the pandemic and ahead of the 2024 Bollington Festival.

The stories, scripts and songs for the 2023 and 2024 projects will be the latest of many written specially by BFMT's director Donald Judge, aiming to make them relevant and accessible to local children. Peg's Eggs is loosely based on a chapter in Alison Uttley's The Country Child and will feature English folk songs. Jeanne's Noël tells of Joan of Arc growing up in countryside not unlike Bollington's, with sheep and English and French carols. Get in the Queue James! imagines the boyhood of James Chadwick, an outstanding scientist born in Bollington in 1891, with songs popular in Victorian England.



welcomes boys and girls aged 7-13 who are interested in drama and music and keen to perform. There are tasters to find out what happens. There are no auditions. participation is maximised, and solo roles are cast as part of the rehearsal process. It's a workshop approach which aims to develop theatre skills and confidence. Some "homework" eg learning words and songs is requested, but there are never additional rehearsals outside the regular Sundays. Public performances on the final Sunday afternoon depend on having sufficient numbers, but the children always experience being on stage with costumes, props, lighting and live music.
